

"THE LATE MRS. HOLLINGSWORTH.

"Mrs. Anne E. Hollingsworth, widow of the late Daniel Hollingsworth of the Township of Escott, died on Friday last, Sept. 3rd (1898-Ed.) in her 78th year. She was one of the early settlers in this section of the country, having settled in the Township of Escott when it was still a dense forest. Born at Fermoy, Ireland on the 24th May, 1820, she arrived in Canada nearly sixty years ago. Seven children survive her, four sons and three daughters. The sons are in prosperous circumstances at or in the immediate neighbourhood of the old homestead, while two out of her three daughters are married and have families. The funeral took place from her late residence to the Mallorytown (Leeds County, Ontario - Ed.) cemetery on Sunday, Sept. 5th., where her remains were laid alongside those of her husband. The funeral service was taken by Rev. C.J. Young, B.A., pastor of St. Paul's church, Escott, the following friends and neighbours being pall-bearers: Messrs R. Waldron, Peter O'Brien, N. Taylor, Dennis Donovan, D. Hutchison and V. Andress.

"The funeral was very largely attended, over 100 vehicles following from the house."
