(1) Mrs. Elizabeth Hollingsworth Dole - 1945.

Elizabeth Hollingsworth Dole, daughter of Henry Lee and Ann Maria Hollingsworth was born in Buckingham, Quebec, Nov. 20, 1854. She passed on to her eternal reward on May 25, 1945 at the home of her daughter, Mrs. R. J. Quinn, Arkansas City, Kansas at the age of 90. On Oct. 21, 1875 she was married to William Elgin Dole of Thurso, Quebec, who preceded her in death Sept. 20, 1943. In 1888 they moved with their family to Dakota Territory where they lived until 1901 when they moved to a farm near Geuda Springs, Kansas. In 1936, because of the illness of Mr. Dole, they came to live with their daughter, Mrs. R. J. Quinn.

Mrs. Dole is survived by their six children; Mrs. R. J. Quinn of Arkansas City, Kansas; Mrs. E. F. Wolf of Rochester, Minnesota; Mrs. Vernon Hodges of Kansas City, Mo.; Mrs. R. T. Remer of Center Point, Iowa; Mr. Harry L. Dole of Duluth, Minnesota, Algar H. Dole of Omaha, Nebraska; and sixteen grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. Two sons preceded her in death, John Elgin in 1888 at Thurso, Quebec and William Wesley in 1918 at Ashton, Kansas.

When a young woman she was converted in a revival in the Wesleyan Methodist Church of which she became a member. Later she dedicated herself to the Lord in the experience of Holiness. Her Christian influence has been felt by all who have known her. Her children often saw her with her open bible or hymnal propped up in a convenient place while she did her work. Truly she sang her way through life. Even in her last illness she sang the old hymns in the night time as well as the day. Very often she was heard singing the hymn she loved so dearly,

There's a land that is fairer than day,  
And by faith we can see it afar;  
For the Father waits over the way,  
To prepare us a dwelling place there.

In the sweet by and by,  
We shall meet on that beautiful shore.

Mrs. Dole was always devoted to her family and nothing seemed to please her more than to have her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren visit with her.
