(10) Clare Hollingsworth also sends us a clipping he made from the Edmonton Journal for Sat. Feb. 4, 1984, p. C-6. The photo above the one column article shows Playwright Margaret Hollingsworth. The article itself is headed "Woman's touch sets the stage," and it is datelined Vancouver (CP). Margaret, admitting herself a feminist, was in Vancouver to promote her new play "War Baby," opening at the Waterfront Theatre. The play is about a 42-year-old woman who decides to have a baby, "a play about the 80s," as she calls it. We learn that Margaret Hollingsworth is a native of England, and worked there as a journalist and librarian. She did some theatre work there, before moving to Thunder Bay, Ontario, in 1968, coming on to Vancouver in 1972. That move was made in order to attend the University of British Columbia to study creative writing. She obtained her master of fine arts degree in theatre in 1972. Since then she has been a fulltime playwright, with seven plays under her belt. Most deal with the woman's point of view in Canada. Yet, she has not been well received except at the New Play Centre in Vancouver and the Belfry in Victoria; hence, her removal to Toronto last October.
